**Holy Father's Prayer
Intentions for March**

- **Universal Intention** - Scientists. That those involved in scientific research may serve the well-being of the whole human person.
- **Evangelization Intention** - Contribution of Women. That the unique contribution of women to the life of the Church may be recognized always.

Today (Sunday) we will be having the annual Lenten Parish Reconciliation Services in each parish. These days Reconciliation or Confession is much less popular than it was at one time. Many Catholics seem to be uncomfortable with the sacrament. Those who join the Church from other ecclesial communities find this practice to be the most difficult to accept. It is ironic that, as Catholic hesitates to use this sacrament; the secular world seems to embrace the idea of confession. From what I can see of reality shows is that the central tenet of them seems to be a public admission of guilt and wrongdoing. Some of the more popular books are the so-called "tell all" books. I have heard stories on Public Radio from psychologists that people retelling their story is a healing aspect of treatment for PTSD. In Alcoholics Anonymous the 4th step is to make a searching and fearless moral inventory of oneself. The 5th step is to admit to God, to oneself and to another human being the exact nature of one's wrongs.

The point of Reconciliation is not to inflict guilt or shame on a person. Rather by admitting to another human being that we are weak and make mistakes, we will find healing and forgiveness. In the sacrament the priest represents both God and the Church. When we admit our wrongs to the priest, we submit ourselves to the judgment of God. This is the scary sounding part, we all fear being judged especially by someone who is totally good. The reality is that God has already judged us in the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. He has declared us to be forgiven. The problem with that judgment is that it is vague and general. In the gospels we see commonly that Jesus reaches out and touches the people He wants to heal. So it is in this sacrament. When we acknowledge our sins to the priest, we allow Christ to speak through the priest to us telling us that our sins have been washed away. Not merely are we forgiven, we are absolved. We are made new creatures, holy in God's eyes. The wonder of the sacrifice of Christ is not just a historical memory but an action that reaches out and touches us today.

Holy Week

Palm Sunday - Next week is Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday we will need two proclaimers; a volunteer will be needed to assist with reading The Passion along with the reader. There will be the regular blessing of the palms as well.

Tuesday - On Tuesday morning, the Chrism Mass will be at the Fargo Cathedral at 11; therefore there will be no regular 9am Tuesday Mass.

Sacred Triduum starts on Thursday Evening with Holy Thursday Mass at 7 pm. At Holy Thursday mass there will be the washing of the feet. I will be looking for volunteers to have their feet washed. There will also be the presentation of the oil. The oils being presented are: the oil of the sick, the oil of catechumens, and the sacred chrism. Volunteers will also be needed to present oils during offertory. At the end of Holy Thursday service there will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Adoration will go until 11pm. The idea of adoration is based on the passion of Jesus when Jesus said to his disciples 'Could you not pray one hour with me.' I have decided to end adoration at 11 so more people can come and be more concentrated in numbers. In the past we have gone until midnight.

Good Friday - On Good Friday there will be a service at 3pm. The Good Friday service includes the reading of the passion, adoration of the cross and Holy Communion. On Good Friday Evening there will be Stations of the Cross and veneration of the cross at 7pm. On the Holy Week list for Good Friday insert the following: Riverside E Free Evangelical will host the Ecumenical Good Friday Service at noon.

Easter Vigil - Easter Vigil on Saturday at 830 pm. We will start with the sacred fire and blessing of the Pascal candle. There will be the singing of the Easter proclamation, scripture service with five readings, and the blessing of the Easter water. We will be also confirming Tyler Uhlenkamp.

Easter Sunday - Easter Sunday will be the regular schedule with Easter mass at 830 in Hunter and 11 at Our Lady of Peace.
