MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR - CHRISM MASS

Next Tuesday I plan to attend the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral in Fargo. In a smaller diocese this would have ordinarily celebrated on the morning of Holy Thursday. Because of our distances we have it earlier in the week. This is an important celebration for the Sacramental life of the diocese. At this Mass the sacred oils are blessed and consecrated. The oil that many are least aware of is the Oil of Catechumens. This oil is used in Baptism. At infant baptism it is a minor ritual before the blessing of the water. Its real meaning comes out in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. The Oil of Catechumens represents the grace of God strengthening the person preparing to be baptized. Baptism is a powerful encounter with Christ. Through the power of the Holy Spirit the catechumen is entering into the mystery of the Death and Resurrection of Christ. The catechumen is being prepared to give up the life of Adam in order to rise to the life of Christ. The Oil of Catechumens strengthens the catechumen to freely surrender his or her old life to experience the new life in the Holy Trinity and in the Church.

The Oil of the Sick is the oil used as a prayer for healing in the Sacrament of the Sick. At one time this was called Extreme Unction. The name is changed to emphasize it is not just about healing the soul preparing for death. It is about healing our spirits in any serious illness and asking for the favor of bodily healing as well. It is the prayer of the Church reaching out to embrace and support a person that is being isolated by illness.

The Sacred Chrism is oil that has been perfumed with flowers and herbs as it is consecrated. This oil is the symbol of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit as He enters a person to give them the grace to serve God and His people. This oil is used in baptism of infants, Confirmation and Holy Orders. When a person older than seven years old is baptized, he or she is confirmed as part of the same ritual. Whether in Baptism or Confirmation the Chrism is a sign that the person has been anointed into the roles of Priest, Prophet and King through Christ. In the sacrament of Holy Orders a person is anointed with Chrism oil to represent that he is called to represent Christ the priest, prophet and king in a new and fuller way.

Because of the connections between Chrism Oil and the priestly role of presiding over the Eucharist being represented at the Mass of the Last Supper, the Chrism Mass has a special focus on priests. At this Mass the priests are called upon to renew each year their promise to be faithful to God by carrying out their ministry. At this Mass the priests are encouraged to renew their enthusiasm and commitment to assist the bishop in leading the Church of the Diocese of Fargo towards the supernatural life of grace with God.

Holy Week

Palm Sunday - Next week is Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday we will need two proclaimers; a volunteer will be needed to assist with reading The Passion along with the reader. There will be the regular blessing of the palms as well.

Tuesday - On Tuesday morning, the Chrism Mass will be at the Fargo Cathedral at 11; therefore there will be no regular 9am Tuesday Mass.

Sacred Triduum starts on Thursday Evening with Holy Thursday Mass at 7 pm. At Holy Thursday mass there will be the washing of the feet. I will be looking for volunteers to have their feet washed. There will also be the presentation of the oil. The oils being presented are: the oil of the sick, the oil of catechumens, and the sacred chrism. Volunteers will also be needed to present oils during offertory. At the end of Holy Thursday service there will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Adoration will go until 11pm. The idea of adoration is based on the passion of Jesus when Jesus said to his disciples 'Could you not pray one hour with me.' I have decided to end adoration at 11 so more people can come and be more concentrated in numbers. In the past we have gone until midnight.

Good Friday - On Good Friday there will be a service at 3pm. The Good Friday service includes the reading of the passion, adoration of the cross and Holy Communion. On Good Friday Evening there will be Stations of the Cross and veneration of the cross at 7pm. On the Holy Week list for Good Friday insert the following: Riverside E Free Evangelical will host the Ecumenical Good Friday Service at noon.

Easter Vigil - Easter Vigil on Saturday at 830 pm. We will start with the sacred fire and blessing of the Pascal candle. There will be the singing of the Easter proclamation, scripture service with five readings, and the blessing of the Easter water. We will be also confirming Tyler Uhlenkamp.

Easter Sunday - Easter Sunday will be the regular schedule with Easter mass at 830 in Hunter and 11 at Our Lady of Peace.
