### MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR HOLY WEEK

Today on Palm Sunday we begin the celebration of the holiest week of the year. Today we remember Jesus triumphal entry as king of the Jews into Jerusalem. He is a humble king entering on the back of a donkey welcomed especially by the people of Galilee in Jerusalem for the annual Passover feast. But even a humble entry is too frightening for the Roman and Jewish authorities. Through the influence of Satan they work together to try to destroy a man they see as a potential threat. The irony that John's gospel especially proposes is that the very act of trying to destroy Jesus by raising him on a cross becomes his successful triumph. Through his ultimate sacrifice for humanity accepting rejection and abandonment by all who followed, Jesus by His death on the Cross has restored us to union with God. He has broken down the barriers that we continually erect between us and God's love for us.

Jesus invites to join the family of God, to be washed clean of our sins and to be nourished by His body and blood. Though He has won the victory He waits for us to claim that victory. Each of us must say over and over "I believe and I accept your gift of salvation" in our words, actions and eventually the commitment of our lives. John's gospel notes that the flesh, the world and the devil constantly conspire to prevent us from claiming that victory. We may be too busy too tired to pray or honor Jesus' work. The stories of the world seem more exciting than to listen to the stories of God and his work in the Scriptures. We can see the failings of other sinners and dismiss them as hypocrites to justify staying away from God. Holy Week offers us a choice, do we claim our victory in Christ by sacrificing our time and energy to pray with Him or do we follow the path of least resistance offered to us by the devil, the world or the flesh.
