MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR EASTER SYMBOLS

Today we celebrate the Resurrection of our Savior and Lord, Jesus the Christ. On this feast I thought it would be interesting to look at some of the common Catholic symbols of Easter. Catholicism is a very incarnational faith. We believe firmly that God uses earthy symbols to reveal Himself to us. Jesus is the fullest symbol being God taking on human flesh. The Holy Spirit acts through baptized believers to form a community that is both the Body of Christ and the People of God. Through the Church Jesus acts upon each of us to make us holy using earthy symbols such as water for Baptism, bread and wine for the Eucharist, olive oil for Confirmation, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick, and words and gestures for Reconciliation and Matrimony. Other symbols are used to celebrate and acknowledge the work and presence of God.

The primary symbol is the lamb. Sourced in the sacrificial offerings in the Scriptures, John the Baptist declared Jesus to be the Lamb of God, the perfect sacrifice. For many cultures eating lamb on Easter celebrates the gift of life we receive in the Resurrection. Eggs and butterflies symbolize death and Resurrection. The caterpillar wrapping itself into a cocoon from which a butterfly emerges. From the apparent solidness of the egg comes a new born chick. Each of these provides a visual symbol for the transition from one kind of life to a higher level of life.

The Easter bunny has a less of a direct connection with Christianity. Even before Christianity the prolific rabbit symbolized fertility in the spring. The image of life and abundance in the spring became a natural symbol. Since eggs also have that connection with new birth and life, it seems easy to see how the Easter bunny becomes connected with Easter eggs.

Ham also has an indirect connection to Easter. In Indo-European cultures the pig symbolized good luck. Festive occasions were celebrated by eating pork. Easter being the highest festive occasion for Christian's ham becomes an appropriate symbolic food.
