## MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR FAMILY AND MARRIAGE: Man and Woman

The matrimonial covenant, that we call marriage, is established by a man and a woman. This assertion by the Church in canon 1055 has its basis in Sacred Scripture. The first creation story in Genesis describes humanity as made in the image of God, male and female He created them. This suggests that the best image of God we had until the Incarnation of the Word in Jesus was the union of man and woman. God who is love creates human beings with the purpose and vocation to love. The mutual love of a man and a woman symbolize God who established Creation as an object to receive His love. In the Incarnation we see just how truly marriage symbolizes God. In the Incarnation we come to realize that God is a communion of Person, similar to the family being a union of persons. Every family is in its own position in a continuum of trying to become a union of love. The unity of the Father, the Son and the Spirit serves as the ideal goal that all families hope and strive for.

The second creation story supports this same ideal. In that story God has created the first human being out of clay and breathed life into him. God proclaims that it is not good for the human to be alone. The human names the animals, declaring his dominion over them, but finds none of them suitable to be true companions. God transforms the human taking a rib from the human and forms a woman from it. The two both come from the same flesh and so are to be equals and counterparts. The author of Genesis completes the story of creating a man and a woman saying "Therefore a man leaves his father and mother and cleaves to his wife and they become one flesh." Jesus affirms this purpose by recalling this statement and adding "So they are no longer two but one flesh."

The Scriptures are teaching that the origin and purpose of marriage is to nurture a unity and love that will symbolize that of our God. Just as the love of God is reflected in creation so the love of a man and woman comes to fulfillment in the creation of a family.
