MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR SIMPLICITY OF CHILD

As I was thinking about the message for this week the scripture readings for Tuesday were about special love that God had for children. Jesus calls a child, puts his arms around the child and says if you want to be important in the kingdom of heaven, you must become like a child. Children in Jesus' day did not have much importance, especially children living and playing in the streets. They are simply dependent on the community to provide them with needed shelter and food. Yet Jesus says their angels look on the face of God. How do we become like a child? That is the biggest challenge. God simply asks that we put our trust in Him. We worry and want life to go our way. We have wonderful dreams but do we ever think about how they fit into God's plan. In the last 10 years or so I have experienced major interruptions in the direction I thought I was going with my life: the colostomy, the characinoid tumor and now the struggle with my vision. It is difficult to let go and just allow God to work His way at His time. Yet what other choice do I have. God has His plans for me. Even as I face these experiences there is a sense of wonder. Each of these experiences could have been the end of life but God has chosen to be with me as I go through life. At my best I try to keep a sense of wonder and hope at what God intends for me. I admit that often I feel frustrated at the pace of healing. I would like to be done now. But perhaps there is a lesson for me and for our parishes. Being disabled visually, I am dependent on parishioners providing transportation for me. For me this is part of the role of a child, simply trusting and hoping that someone will get me to where I need to be. For all of us there are going to be moments when we lose the independence and self-sufficiency that we like to imagine ourselves having. That can feel like a loss. Jesus seems to be saying that actually that can be our hope. It will not be our accomplishments that will give us glory in the eyes of God. It will be our simplicity in trusting that God is with us and caring for us even when we feel like we may be failing at life.


"How can I tell if my child needs stitches for a cut?" is a common question asked by parents. Between the playground, sports, and the rough-and-tumble of everyday life, kids end up with bruises, scrapes, and cuts from time to time. While these often require little more than some disinfectant and a bandage, it's important to know when a cut might need medical attention or even a few stitches. A child may need stitches if the cut: *** is still bleeding after you apply pressure for 5 minutes * is gaping or wide* appears deep * is on your child's face or neck* contains glass or other debris*has an object sticking out of it, such as a twig* spurts blood**

If a cut is spurting blood, it may be because an artery has been nicked. The wound should be treated and stitched immediately so that its edges can come together and heal properly.

A common concern with cuts is whether a tetanus shot is necessary. A child who has not had a tetanus shot within the last 5 years might need one to protect against infection. A child may also need a shot if the wound was caused by rusty metal, is contaminated with dirt or saliva, or is a bite from an animal. The tetanus shot must be given within 48 hours after the wound occurred. But the sooner the shot is given, the better, as it will help to lower the risk of infection. These guidelines can help you determine whether your child needs immediate medical attention, but ultimately, doctors in your local clinic or emergency room are the ones who can best decide whether a cut needs stitches.
