Because of the 4th nerve palsy my left eye is not working with my right eye. Not only does this make it impossible for me to drive but it also slows down my reading. As a result I am much less efficient in reading and getting things done. But it seems as I take my time I have been eventually able to get what is needed done. So at this time I have decided not to ask for retirement. I am hoping that perhaps with time some of these issues will improve with time. In the meantime you can help me especially by being available for driving me around. I do have a sign-up sheet on the parlor door for bringing me to Hunter on weekends. At times I will be having doctor appointments in Fargo during the week. We could also use my car on occasion as it should be used to keep everything in good shape. It is an automatic transmission so it is easy to drive. I ask you to keep praying for me for healing where it is God's will and for the grace to adapt to whatever is God's will for me.




**Dear friends in Jesus Christ,** Today we celebrate the 21st Sunday in the ordinary time. In today's word of God it seems to be easy to understand but it is not that much easy to enter into the kingdom of God.

**1. The idea of salvation in the time of Jesus, coming from the heart of people** The whole teaching of Jesus is about the salvation and the redemption of mankind. But if you go deeper into the teaching of Jesus at his time the idea of salvation was prevailing in the midst of the people. Jesus was a Jew and he was teaching to the people of Jew for whom the idea of salvation was nothing. During the time of Jesus itself the idea of salvation begins to reflect in the heart of people. Luke 13:22 someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" He answered them.. Mk 10:35 20 Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him. 21 "What is it you want?" he asked. She said, "Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom." ...Good Master, what good thing shall I do, that I may have eternal life?" (Matthew 19.26

**2. The one who begins to search for salvation is moved by the Holy Spirit** Searching for salvation is the gift of the Holy Spirit It is so difficult for many to speak about his or others salvation. As far as you are within the bondage of the evil spirit you cannot speak about your salvation. The moment you come out of your bondage you would be able to speak about your salvation. When the Holy Spirit cleanse your heart with the divine power and move you to new life, then you would begin to search for your salvation. The moment you receive the gift of the Holy Spirit that is the very moment you begins to search for your salvation.

**3. Enter the Narrow Gate** The gate to heaven is narrow and gate to hell is wider. Eternal life in heaven is for eternal at the same time eternal damn in hell is also for eternal. Narrow road leads to heaven and wider road leads to hell. What is the narrow gate and what is the wider gate? Narrow gate is the life of merits with mercy, love and compassion. Wider gate is the life of sins on earth. If you are moving with love and compassion, then you are walking through narrow gate, and if you are moving with all kinds of sins, then you are walking through wider gate.
