MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR **CHRISTMAS SEASON**

As we enter into the glorious feast of Christmas, I wish you all a Merry Christmas. Christmas celebrates the wonder of God who is completely beyond our understanding choosing to become one of us. He chooses to be born of a lowly virgin. His birth is so lowly that Joseph almost divorced his betrothed wife because of the suspicious circumstances of His coming birth. Only through the message of an angel in dream did Joseph continue to be part of the family.

Today the fourth Sunday of Advent we are in both the preparation season of Advent and beginning of the Christmas Season. For a week before Christmas, beginning Tuesday the 17^{t,h} the Church in its official Evening Prayer celebrates the "O Antiphons". Each antiphon recited before and after the "Magnificat" of Mary (the prayer where Mary begins "my soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord...") announces a title of the Messiah anticipated in the Old Testament. The Advent Song "O Come O Come Emmanuel" celebrates each title with a verse. These titles are O Wisdom, O sacred Lord, O Root of Jesse, O Key of David, O Radiant Dawn, O King of all the nations and O Emmanuel (God is with Us).

Christmas is a powerful feast that includes many mysteries. Jesus is born king of the Jews but is recognized only by lowly shepherds who wander night and day with their sheep in the hills and by foreign astrologers. On this feast we celebrate the wonder that family life is the beginning of the Church. Through his life with Joseph and Mary Jesus comes to learn that He is not just human but that He has a unique relationship with God, that He is the Son of God.

The Christmas season comes to conclusion in the Baptism of Jesus where He begin His public ministry. This ministry is announcing to us that we are being called to join the special relationship with Jesus. God is inviting us to become adopted sons and daughters of God. This is the ultimate joy of Christmas. We are not mere creatures of God. God wants us to be His children and to experience His love. So let us celebrate Christmas. God has chosen to rejoice in us and wants us to rejoice in Him.
