MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR EUCCHARISTIC PRAYERS VIII

The last parts of the Eucharistic Prayers are the Intercessions and the Doxology with the Great Amen. The Intercessions are the expression of our belief that the Church is a communion not just of those here present but of all believers living and dead. This is that last part of the prayer for all the Eucharistic Prayers except Eucharistic Prayer I which has two sets of intercessions, one before and one after the Consecration. In the Intercessions we ask the Blessed Virgin Mary, the angels, the apostles and all the saints to pray for us. Within the past year an addition intercession was added after the blessed Virgin Mary, *blessed Joseph, her spouse*, to all the Eucharistic Prayers. The sense of communion is also expressed in who we ask the communion of saints to pray for along with us. We pray for our Holy Father by name as well as our Bishop by name along with the whole Order of Bishops. It is through our bishop, united in communion with the Holy Father and all the bishops that we are part of the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. The universal sense of communion is further expressed as we pray for all the clergy, those believers take part in this offering and those gathered here for this act of worship. We even pray for all people who seek God with a sincere heart. This phrase recognizes that there are many people who may not recognize the Catholic Church as the source of salvation but are sincerely seeking God to the best of their ability. With this sincere faith we accept them as part of our communion of faith and so we pray for them. Also included in this communion are our loved ones who dwell now in the peace of Christ as well as those who have died with a faith only known by God.

Our prayer is that all of these with us will be the Body of Christ giving glory to God looking forward to the day when we will see Him in all His glory. This is explicitly expressed in the final doxology where we proclaim ourselves to *be through Him (Christ), with Him (Christ) and in Him (Christ)*. As the one Body of Christ we address ourselves to *O God, Almighty Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit*. Our prayer ends that *all glory and honor is yours, forever and ever*. We end with the acclamation of the great *Amen* by the assembly. Amen is a Hebrew word of affirmation. It has the emphatic sense of not simply agreeing but insisting "So be it." This acclamation is said as the priest elevates the consecrated bread and wine. With this Amen we are acclaiming and affirming that we are welcoming our part in the sacrifice Jesus made for us on the cross which had been renewed for us today.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

At the recent Joint Parish Council meeting discussion came up about having scheduled adoration at the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Essential to faith is a habit of prayer. There are many types of prayer that are valuable to strengthening our relationship with our God. A longstanding form of prayer has been adoration before the exposed Blessed Sacrament. Taking time for meditation or contemplation before the sacrament can deepen our reverence for the Eucharist. In the Eucharist we celebrate the sacrificial presence of Jesus as He unites us together into His Body. When we worship Christ in the host that is exposed, we are reminded that we have been made holy and inserted into the very Body of Jesus. To establish this devotion in [Our Lady of Peace](#) we have decided to start with a two hour period every Wednesday from 7 PM to 9 PM. To have this adoration it is necessary that there always be two people praying before the Blessed Sacrament during the exposition. There will be signup sheets with ½ hour time slots. Once it is clear that there will be three or four people committed to regular adoration during these time slots, we will begin the adoration. As Jesus said to Peter during the agony in the garden: "Couldn't you watch with me even one hour?"
