MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

COMMUNION RITE: LORD'S PRAYER

After the Doxology and Great Amen we begin the final preparations for a full encounter with the Body and Blood of Jesus. The Communion rite begins with the Lord's Prayer. In the earlier translation there were several options for introducing the Lord's Prayer or the priest could use his own words. The revised translation requires a specific introduction. The introduction speaks of "daring" to call God "Our Father". The emphasis here is on transcendental greatness of God who created the universe and is the source of all life. Who would dare to approach a powerful king and use such intimate language as "father"? Yet Jesus has commanded us to do so. His command itself teaches us that we have been and are being transformed by the sacrifice Jesus made on the Cross for us and renews for us by bringing us into this great mystery. God has adopted us as His children first by baptism when we first died to the Adam within us and rose to new life in Christ. Now by the power of the Holy Spirit we are being incorporated even more fully into the Body of Christ as we prepare to make Him one with us by eating Him. We dare to call God "our Father" because He has made us one with His Son. In Jesus we are sons and daughters of the almighty God.

The version of the Lord's Prayer that we are familiar with and is used in the liturgy is from St. Matthew's Gospel. The Gospel of St. Luke has a different version. Three of the seven petitions of the Lord's Prayer focus on God and the last four focus on our needs. In Scripture a name is not simply an external identifier. It is associated with the interior identify of the person. So when we pray that God's name be hallowed, we are praying that God will be recognized and honored by the universe of the holiness that is His. We pray that God's reign will come into fullness. The world can never truly find peace and contentment until God is recognized as the true sovereign of the world. In heaven, the fulfillment of God's work, the will of God is fully realized. We pray that His will might be done on earth so that the world will experience the joy of heaven. God is feeding us with daily bread that is so much greater than ordinary bread. Instead of bread that turns into us as we consume it, this bread turns us into the Body of Christ. As we are transformed into members of the Body of Christ our sins are forgiven, to the extent that we have forgiven our neighbors. Trusting in the love of the Father for His children we pray that He will assist us as we strive not to enter into temptation and that He will deliver us from evil.

This prayer for deliverance is expressed more fully in the "Embolism" that follows the Lord's Prayer but precedes the doxology. We ask God to deliver us from evil and give us peace. We seek freedom from sin and distress while we are waiting in hope for the full coming of Jesus into our lives and that of the world.

The final doxology reflects the praise celebrated at the heavenly liturgy in the Book of Revelation. It also goes back to the act of praise David gives to God when he transfers his throne to his son Solomon.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

At the recent Joint Parish Council meeting discussion came up about having scheduled adoration at the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Essential to faith is a habit of prayer. There are many types of prayer that are valuable to strengthening our relationship with our God. A longstanding form of prayer has been adoration before the exposed Blessed Sacrament. Taking time for meditation or contemplation before the sacrament can deepen our reverence for the Eucharist. In the Eucharist we celebrate the sacrificial presence of Jesus as He unties us together into His Body. When we worship Christ in the host that is exposed, we are reminded that we have been made holy and inserted into the very Body of Jesus. To establish this devotion in our parishes we have decided to start with a two hour period every Wednesday from 7 PM to 9 PM at Our Lady of Peace. To have this adoration it is necessary that there always be two people praying before the Blessed Sacrament during the exposition. There will be signup sheets in each parish with ½ hour time slots. Once it is clear that there will be three or four people committed to regular adoration during these time slots, we will begin the adoration. As Jesus said to Peter during the agony in the garden: "Couldn't you watch with me even one hour?"
