MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR PENTECOST

Today is the Feast of Pentecost. This is the third most important celebration in the Church after Christmas and Easter.

Unfortunately because it occurs during the summer break, it tends to slip by unnoticed. Easter is the highest feast because it celebrates the death and resurrection of Jesus, which conquers sin and death and gives us hope for eternal life.

At Christmas God becomes human in the flesh of Jesus to reveal to us God's promise of hope and love. These events celebrate the Father choosing to reveal Himself to us through the Son. It is not sufficient for God to simply reveal Himself to us. It is necessary for us to hear and to accept this gift into our lives so fully that we are transformed into holy beings. Jesus promised His disciples that He would ask the Father to send us another Advocate. The Holy Spirit is this Advocate who empower us to hear the Word of God and then to put our faith in God. Jesus' disciples experienced the power of the Holy Spirit according to Luke in a strong wind that filled the upper room where they were waiting.

According to John they also experienced the Spirit when Jesus breathed on them and gave them the power to forgive and retain sins. Common to both images is air. We tend to take air for granted unless for some reason we are cut off from it.

If we are cut off from air we cannot survive more than a few minutes. Usually we do not think about air. When air begins to move, we call it wind. As wind it can give us comfort on a hot day or it can become a force so powerful that nothing can stand against it. The Holy Spirit is like the wind. The Spirit can be as still as calm air or the Spirit can give us comfort when we are in need. The Spirit can even become such a force that He can move us to change the world. An example of the power of the Spirit is recorded in the life of St. Paul. He talks about going through beatings, going through storms on the sea, being stoned and yet going on to travel throughout the Middle East proclaiming the gospel of Jesus love and forgiveness. We may not emphasize Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit as much as the gift of Christ at Christmas and Easter. Yet we can still call upon the Holy Spirit and ask Him to move us closer to the Father through Christ.
