MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR HOLY COMMUNION

Following the Breaking of the Bread, Lamb of God, begins the immediate preparation for Holy Communion. First the priest prepares himself by saying quietly a prayer that he may fruitfully receive the Body and Blood of Christ. During this silent prayer members of the congregation should also be praying quietly for the fruitful reception of Communion. Showing the host and chalice in a minor elevation the priest begins a prayer with the words: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world." These words echoing the Lamb of God come from John the Baptist's testimony about Jesus when He came to be baptized in the Jordan. The last part of the prayer with the host elevated, "Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb," comes from the book of Revelation. John the author of the book of Revelation reports that an angel tells him to write "Blessed are those called to the wedding feast of the Lamb" and that these words come from God Himself. These words symbolize the intimate relationship that Christ desires to have with us. He is the Bridegroom and we the Church are invited to be His Bride to become one with Him. In response to this invitation we imitate the centurion who said to Jesus: "Lord I am not worthy that you should come under my roof...but say the word and my servant will be healed." Exchanging the word "my soul" for "my servant" we acknowledge our need for healing and forgiveness to be worthy of becoming the bride of Christ. As we come to the priest or minister of Holy Communion we hear the words "the Body of Christ" or "the Blood of Christ". Our "Amen" is an act of faith and acceptance that we are willing to be transformed by this supernatural food that we eat and drink. We have become one with Jesus and with those with whom we share His body and blood. We are now truly children of God. We have been made into divine beings, one with Jesus, adopted into the Blessed Trinity. We celebrate this union by praising God either in silence or in song. The priest purifies the sacred vessels with another silent prayer asking that he be purified for eternity by this sacred food.
