## MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR CONCLUDING RITES

After the distribution of communion and cleansing of the vessels, in the Prayer after Communion the priest prays for the spiritual effects of the Eucharist to take effect in our lives. The Mass ends with an almost mirror image of how the Mass began. The priest says the greeting "the Lord be with you" and then all make the sign of the cross. The context of this sign of the cross is a blessing of the assembly which is made in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. As an alternative to this simple blessing, the priest may say a prayer over the people or a solemn blessing. These are more commonly used in more solemn times. The "Prayer over the People" tends to be associated with penitents and penitential seasons. Each day of Lent has a specific "prayer over the people".

The prayer over the people or the solemn blessing is usually introduced by a deacon (if present) or the priest with the invitation "Bow down for the blessing". The solemn blessing is made up of three invocations to which people respond "Amen". The "Prayer over the People" is simply one longer prayer with the response "Amen". After either of these the priest proclaims "And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit come down on you and remain with you forever." With the invocation of the Trinity the priest makes the sign of the cross over the people as the assembly members sign themselves. The word blessing means "good word" (*bene dictio* in Latin or *eu logia* in Greek). With a blessing we are being sent out to transform the world with the assistance of the *good Word* (*Christ*). In this same spirit we are then dismissed. The original Latin dismissal *Ite, missa est* "Go forth, the Mass is ended" has been expanded. Other phrases include "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord", "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" or "Go in peace". We are being sent into the world as a witness and living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God. We accept this mission with the words "Thanks be to God". The Mass ends with the priest and deacon kissing the altar. All are encourage to go out to praise God. Commonly the Mass ends with a closing hymn and procession but this is not necessary. The Mass is actually complete when the priest kisses the altar.
