MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR FAMILY AND MARRIAGE

Having completed my review of the new translation of the Mass, I plan to use this message space to reflect on family life and the sacrament of matrimony. This seems appropriate as Pope Francis has called for a synod this fall to discuss family life and how the Church might improve its ministry to families. In the Code of Canon Law canon 1055 §1 gives the official description of marriage within the Catholic Church: "The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring; this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament." This canon has its source in the teaching by the Second Vatican Council in its document *Gaudium et Spes* §48. Whenever we try to understand something it is important that we have a common premise and understanding from which we work. The above description is how the Church understands the institution often called Matrimony. There are other institutions in civil society that may resemble matrimony but lack certain basic characteristics of matrimony. These include bigamy, polygamy, polyandry, cohabitation, fornication and more recently gay marriage. There are many arguments going on about these other institutions about whether governments should recognize them and about the morality of these institutions. Those are separate questions from what I plan to focus on in the next few weeks. An essential word in the description of matrimony is the word "covenant". Before Vatican II marriage was primarily described as a contract. The similarity between the covenant and contract is that both arise out of a mutual agreement. Contract implies simply obligations and expectations about behaviors that are agreed upon. A covenant has the implication of a commitment of persons. The covenant of marriage is a symbol of the commitment that God makes with his people. If one party violates a provision of a contract, there are usually simple procedures to dissolve the contract. In a covenant when something violates an obligation, the covenant remains. The need for repentance and forgiveness become mandatory. The commitment and obligations of two persons remain paramount even though the covenant may have been wounded. Recognizing the seriousness and challenges to living out a covenant has implications. The Church requires a fair degree of preparation to help persons understand the significance of marriage as a covenant. The concept of annulments or declarations of invalidity come into play as well. There are people who may say the words for establishing a covenant but are either unable or unwilling to fully make this commitment.
